


Too good to be true?

- √ Ask permission to go online
- √ Talk to a grown up

- Go online with people you know
- ✓ Block people if they are threatening or unkind

- √ Have a time limit for online activity
- ✓ Take time out and check something that seems too good to be true
- Stay safe





- Keep things secret
- Use threatening or unkind words

- Spread rumours about people
- Carry on if asked to STOP!
- Spend all your time online

- Click on a link unless you are sure who it is from


George, Ethan, and Damien helped run the KHS Credit Shop.

Maple had a super morning this week at Forest School. They worked and focused really well whilst trying to light the cotton wool with the flint and steel.


They had great fun playing with the ball and some pupils made Pom pom-poms. Some pupils were excited to play with the musical instruments. A lovely morning for all.














Year 11 walked at Alton Water and navigated their way around a new walk. The highlight of the day was seeing the resident Highland Cattle up close.

They used the knives carefully to cut the sandwiches, and thought about other fillings they could use. The most popular filling was ham.



Sam Arter in Maple Class is Star Baker this week, he always enthusiastically joins in with group discussions and tells us about the recipes he has been practicing at home.







Rose E, Faith W, Max D, Tyrese M and Sophia J.



















