Many pupils watched the funeral and processions as the final farewell to Queen Elizabeth II.



Year 11 GCSE pupils have been making good progress on their individual projects.


This week they have experimented with different techniques and mediums to achieve the results they are looking for.



Flu vaccine:

The NHS Nurses who came into school to administer the vaccine were very pleased with the uptake and, as always, impressed with positive pupil behaviour and attitudes! Pupils were given a certificate with the date of vaccine. If your child missed having the vaccine, please contact your GP surgery to arrange.

Whilst people continue to be affected by Covid-19, we need to also look ahead following the pandemic and ensure we maximise pupil learning in school. At the start of the new academic year, it is a good time to focus on individual and whole school attendance. The Government expects the minimum expected attendance rate for every pupil to be 96% or above.

If pupils are frequently late to or absent from school, they, and the whole class, can be affected.

To help parents and carers decide whether they should allow their child a day off school when poorly, The NHS has produced guidance on common illnesses. This guidance is available via NHS - 'Is my child too ill for school?' webpage and underpins our decision on whether the reason provided for absence is to be authorised.

The NHS message is quite clear - it is ok to the allow a child or young person to go to school with some common or minor illnesses. Common colds, minor coughs, sore throats or headaches alone do not mean they are too unwell to attend school. Only absences that are UNAVOIDABLE will be authorised at KHS.

It is really important to speak to Mrs Allen to report any absence, with a clear reason, not just by text.

If pupils are finding it difficult to attend school for any reason, please contact their tutor in the first instance at an early stage so we can work together to resolve any problems that may arise.

PLEASE NOTE: Holidays during term time will not be authorised by the Headteacher unless in exceptional circumstances that we may need evidence and details provided for.
