
Birch class kept up their movement breaks during their Christmas timetable activities.

## COVID-19 UPDATE

**Daily testing of close contacts for COVID-19 - updated guidance for schools** From this week, adults who are fully vaccinated and all children and young people aged between 5 to 18 years and 6 months identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19, are strongly advised to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.

The Department for Education have now updated the <u>schools COVID-19</u> <u>operational guidance</u>.

Daily testing of close contacts of COVID-19 will help make education and childcare settings safer and help keep children and young people in face-to-face education.
